

Literacy:

A range of stories based on food and farming, traditional tales, instructions, letters, descriptive writing, diary writing, role play,



Texts including The Enormous Turnip, Little Red Hen, Jack and the Beanstalk, Farmer Duck, Pig in the pond, Town Mouse and Country Mouse.

Science:

Life cycles, plants, food chains, seasons and growing, products of farming, organic farming.

Thinking scientifically, creating simple investigations, making predictions and writing conclusions.

Numeracy:

Addition and subtraction, number problems, missing numbers, problem solving, multiplication tables (2's, 3's, 4's, 5's and 10's), doubles and halves, number bonds, money, shape, mental maths, inverse operations, division, reading scales, reasoning about number, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and words.

PSHE:

Sun safety, RSE, changes. Moving on.

Music:

Singing songs, playing instruments, creating our own music, exploring different genres.

RE:

God and the Gospel, food banks, communities, prayers.

If animals could talk what would they say?

Art:
